Dear Sirs,

I'm writing this letter on behalf of the family of Debra McNeal and her unborn baby girl who we're brutally murdered in 1997. In this organization we have rarely seen a blatant act by the court that totally dismisses the heinous way Debra was murdered. We strongly request that the parole board deny parole and that he serve the time imposed at his sentencing. Why in the world would you let a cold blooded murderer back out into society? Please deny him the chance to kill again. As you are aware the defendant strangled and stabbed his pregnant wife in a fit of rage. He then drug her across the home they shared and placed her in a bathtub as an attempt to clean up and hide his crime. He shaved her head and used bleach which caused her skin to burn. The case was presented to a jury and he was found guilty of two counts of second degree murder.

Since the day of the murder the defendant has never once showed any emotion or sadness for what he did. . He continues to deny his involvement and has now attempted to blame it on his own brother. This has been presented before an appellate court and they found no evidence of his brother's involvement.

At the time of the murder he was a probation officer and he has continued to manipulate the system, getting the innocent project involved and anyone else who will listen. He continues to manipulate the justice system and even the Governor of the State of California. One could say he is a sociopath.
