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1. Plaintiff, the People of the State of California, by and through Ronald J. Freitas,
District Attorney of San Joaquin County, hereby alleges the following upon information and belief:

### **PARTIES**

- 2. Plaintiff is the People of the State of California ("the People"). The People bring this action by and through its attorneys, Ronald J. Freitas, District Attorney of San Joaquin County; Jason Anderson, District Attorney of San Bernardino County; and Jeff W. Reisig, District Attorney of Yolo County.
- 3. Defendant Dollar Tree Stores, Inc. ("Dollar Tree") is a Virginia corporation. The People are informed and believe, and thereon allege, that Dollar Tree owns and operates a chain of general merchandise stores throughout the United States, including California, doing business as Dollar Tree.
- 4. Defendant Dollar Tree Distribution, Inc. ("Dollar Tree Distribution") is a Virginia corporation. The People are informed and believe, and thereon allege, that Dollar Tree Distribution owns and operates two distribution centers in California, doing business as Dollar Tree Distribution.
- 5. Defendant Family Dollar, LLC ("Family Dollar") is a North Carolina corporation. The People are informed and believe, and thereon allege, that Family Dollar owns and operates a chain of general merchandise stores throughout the United States, including California, doing business as Family Dollar.
- 6. Allegations in this Complaint of Dollar Tree's, Dollar Tree Distribution's, and Family Dollar's (collectively, "Defendants") acts or omissions include the acts and omissions of Defendants' officers, agents, employees, and representatives that were committed while acting within the course and scope of their employment or agency on behalf of Defendants.

### JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 7. Dollar Tree Stores, Inc., Dollar Tree Distribution, Inc., and Family Dollar, LLC, at all times mentioned herein, have transacted business in the County of San Joaquin and elsewhere within the State of California. The violations of law described herein occurred in the County of San Joaquin and elsewhere in California.
  - 8. Venue is proper in this Court under Code of Civil Procedure section 393 because the

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causes of action alleged in this Complaint arose, in part, out of Defendants' conduct in San Joaquin County, California.

## GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

- 9. Dollar Tree owned and/or operated stores in California at all relevant times.
- 10. Dollar Tree Distribution owned and/or operated distribution centers in California at all relevant times.
  - 11. Family Dollar owned and/or operated stores in California at all relevant times.
- 12. Defendants have sold and offered for sale outdated over-the-counter drugs after the expiration date stamped or embossed on such products' containers.
- 13. Defendants did not maintain adequate procedures to ensure all of its locations thoroughly verified and removed over-the-counter drug products whose expiration had passed from its inventory of items available for sale to the public.
- 14. The sale and offering for sale of outdated over-the-counter drug products violates Health and Safety Code section 110286.
- 15. The sale of outdated over-the-counter drug products constitutes unfair business practices within the meaning of California Business and Professions Code section 17200.

# FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

# (Business & Professions Code, § 17200 et seq.)

- 16. Plaintiff restates and incorporates all previous paragraphs.
- 17. Within four years of the date of commencement of this action, Defendants engaged in, among other things, the following unlawful acts, omissions, and practices that constitute unfair competition within the meaning of Business and Professions Code sections 17200 through 17208:
  - a. Defendants have sold and offered for sale outdated over-the-counter drugs after their expiration date had passed, in violation of Health and Safety Code section 110286.
- 18. Each and every separate act in violation of this provision constitutes a separate "business act or practice" of Business and Professions Code section 17200.
  - 19. Based on the above, the People request injunctive relief against Defendants under
